Daniel 1:1-7

(1) The Context Of Exile

- Disobedience Leading To Division -

Then the <u>Lord</u> God said, "Behold, the man has become like one of us in knowing good and evil. Now, lest he reach out his hand and take also of the tree of life and eat, and live forever—" therefore the <u>Lord</u> God sent him out from the garden of Eden to work the ground from which he was taken. He drove out the man, and at the east of the garden of Eden he placed the cherubim and a flaming sword that turned every way to guard the way to the tree of life.

Therefore he brought up against them the king of the Chaldeans, who killed their young men with the sword in the house of their sanctuary and had no compassion on young man or virgin, old man or aged. And they burned the house of God and broke down the wall of Jerusalem and burned all its palaces with fire and destroyed all its precious vessels. He took into exile in Babylon those who had escaped from the sword, and they became servants to him and to his sons until the establishment of the kingdom of Persia, to fulfill the word of the Lord by the mouth of Jeremiah, until the land had enjoyed its Sabbaths. All the days that it lay desolate it kept Sabbath, to fulfill seventy years.

(2) The Nature Of Exile

- Strangers In A Strange Land -

How long, O Lord? Will you be angry forever?
Will your jealousy burn like fire? Pour out your anger on the nations that do not know you, and on the kingdoms

Do not remember against us our former iniquities; let your compassion come speedily to meet us, for we are brought very low.
